


# Pupils leaving or moving at end of Summer Term 2022



I hope you have a wonderful summer and a well-earned rest. We will miss you all!








# Zebra Class














## **Camelot Class**



Drumbeat students have been continuing to take their autism awareness project to different groups within the local community. On Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> July five students attended a school forum with staff support and performed their project to 30 plus secondary school children from Forest Hill boys and Deptford Green schools. All five students were quite nervous at first but coped really well and delivered the workshop brilliantly. Drumbeat are really proud of all of them for managing their nerves and facing their fears.

We got some very positive feedback from the evaluation sheets and there are plans in place to perform the workshop to the fire service, social workers, transport team and hospitals. Our work in this area has given our students a voice out in the community and for them to become ambassadors of Drumbeat. It has also allowed us to develop training packages to deliver to various community groups with the sole aim of increasing awareness of autism and the role of Drumbeat school in the local community.





## Careers fair Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> July

Drumbeat school held a careers fair, life beyond Drumbeat event on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> July at Brockley. We were joined by a number of local colleges and employers including Lewisham and Nash College, the travel training team, adult social care, careers advisory service plus a local hairdressers who has offered our students work experience in the past. We're also saying goodbye to our leavers Kerrel, Kurushiya and Leo this year. They have had an amazing last year and we will miss them all!




#### **Shard Class**
