The school receives extra funding to help your child if they are entitled to free school meals, we can also apply for other funding depending on how many of our students receive Free School Meals. So you wouldn't just be helping your family, you would be helping all of the children who go to Drumbeat.


## Welcome

The children have been enjoying our topic 'Once Upon a Time.' We have been listening to and engaging with traditional tales. We have also been using the story characters across the curriculum.






# Zebras Newsletter

The children have also continued to work really hard on their maths & English targets and are making good progress. **I am very proud of them all this term, as I am always.**



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



## Seahorse Class

Pandas have started creating lots of Easter and Spring artwork such as making Easter chick cards, decorating Easter eggs and making Spring flower collages. In Maths we have been exploring size and measures.



## Newsletter from Key Stage 3


In Key stage Three this term we have been very busy developing our reading, writing, speaking and listening and maths skills at both home and school. All students have accessed learning via our online learning platform; Google Classrooms. It has been a fantastic time to build stronger relationships between home and school through online learning, zoom calls and regular parent calls.

### Excalibur class

In Excalibur class this term they have been learning about habitats. The children have been focussing ordering and structuring their ideas into full sentences. Some of the children have been answering questions about short stories they have read. The children have been working on addition and subtraction problems with numbers up to 100- WOW!

The children have especially enjoyed developing their independence skills at home and school by learning to make simple meals like beans on toast- yummy.

The children are happy to be back at school and are working on their social skills through collaborative play sessions in the afternoons.



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## Merlin class

In Merlin class this term the children have been learning about different religions, celebrations, cultures and languages through the topic 'around the world'. The children have engaged in art, dance, role play, cooking and stories to enrich their experiences.

The children have been developing their reading skills by reading for meaning through recipes, instructions and science experiments. The children have had great success at developing the use of their literacy skills in a functional way.

In Maths the children have been learning about measures and using this in their science and cooking activities. We especially loved our puff pastry gluten free pizzas.

This half term our children have really shone at learning to complete washing, simple meals and brushing teeth independently.



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## Camelot class

In Camelot class this term the children have been learning about habitats. Some of the children engaged with this through sensory exploration of different materials, some of the children were able to write descriptive sentences about where animals live. All children at home and school accessed their usual daily routine; morning work, exercise, circle time and snack time. This has helped the children to stay on schedule and aided a smooth transition back to school.

The children have been working hard in maths accessing work on number recognition and maths operations; addition, subtraction.

The children especially enjoyed weekly assemblies and P.E. sessions on zoom!




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## Lancelot class

In Lancelot class this term the children have been learning about Habitats (Humanities), Maths (Money and Number activities), Literacy (Phonics/Writing/ Reading comprehension) Practical activities linked to festivals, events, e.g. Chinese New Year, Valentine's Day, etc.

The students engaged in completing activities from the home learning pack. Some students engaged in the google classroom learning and particularly enjoyed the short AA videos, Zoom catch up with the rest of the class (they were keen to show off their pets and some items from home to their peers and staff). Parents also attempted to engage in practical tasks like cooking and art following instructions from videos uploaded on the google classroom. PE sessions with Adam also proved to be popular.



## PE at Brockley

Even the lockdown didn't stop our students to keep going. Students have been practising different sport and activities such as yoga, basketball and hockey at school and at home. At Drumbeat students know the importance of sport for both their body and mental health.



## National Careers Week March 1<sup>st</sup> -5<sup>th</sup> Key Stage 4 and 5

Students from Drumbeat Brockley have been celebrating National Careers week (NCW) and have been involved in a week long program of study which has included the following:

- Taking part in two special assemblies and watching films on creative careers which have included the performing arts, crafts, virtual tour of pinewood studios,
- Taking part in live workshops via zoom with Leeds museum to find out about front of house roles and to ask questions and fill out student questionnaires.
- Completing job applications and practice interviews with SLT.
- Completing jobs around the school and at home.
- Creating videos about the types of jobs staff do around school and sharing this in assemblies.
- Students at home have been able to get involved in NCW and have shared videos of jobs they do at home.


## PE with Adam on zoom:

## Key Stage 4 – Learning summary

We focussed mainly on English and Maths, this meant that the students were completing more work in these areas than they usually would.

Because of your hard work it has meant that all students in Key stage 4 have remained on track with their personalised targets and have completed or are on track to complete all of their qualifications! 


