EYFS News

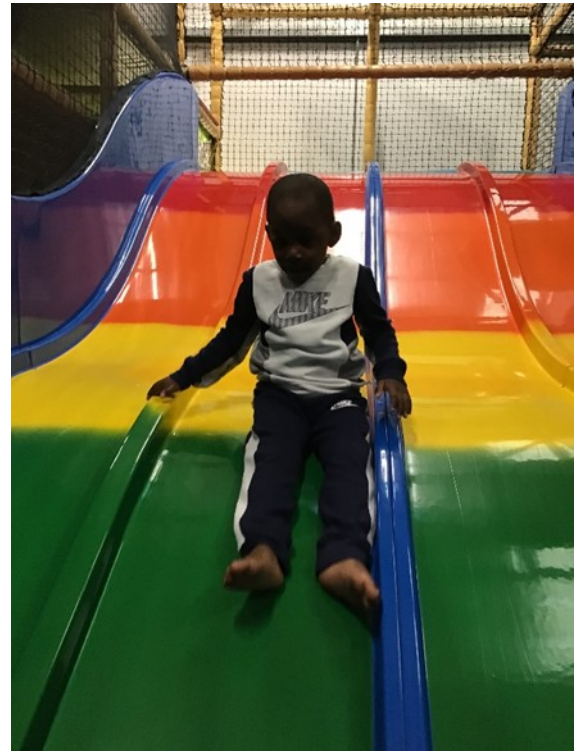

After Christmas our topic will be 'We all go travelling by' and we will be learning about transport and journeys.

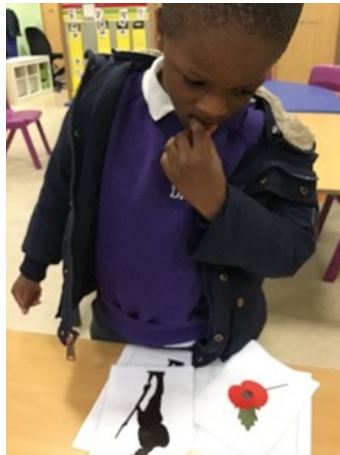

The children are really engaging with their phonics lessons and beginning to recall and say their sounds. It would be great if you could continue to practice with them at home over the holidays. Merlin class have had fun learning all about Christmas. We have decorated the classroom and made some lovely Christmas wreathes.



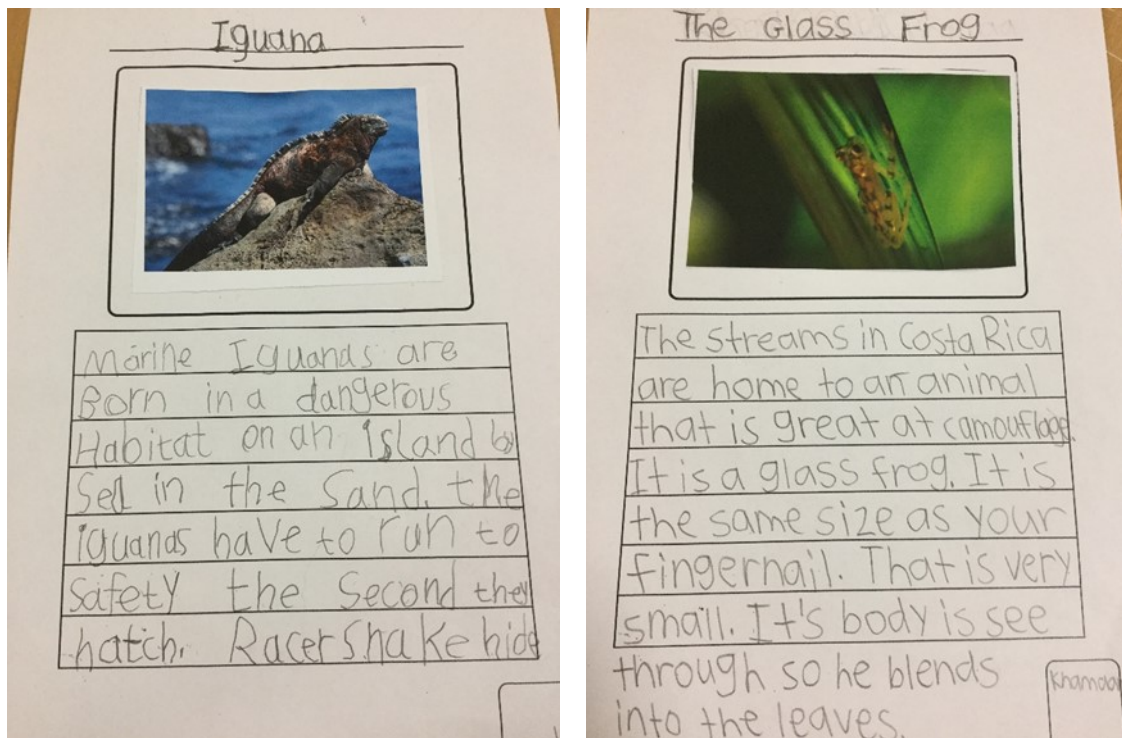
Galahad Class

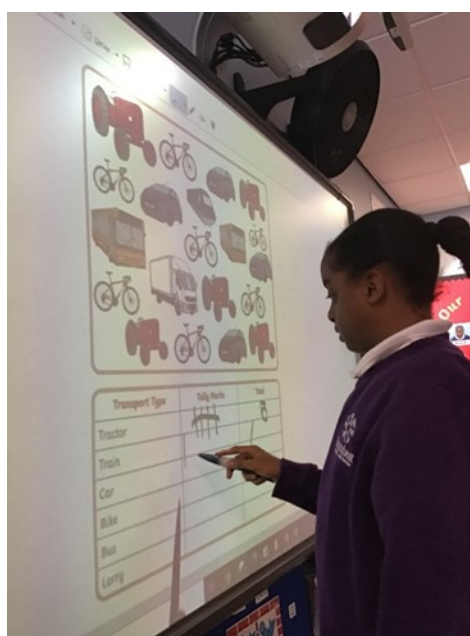
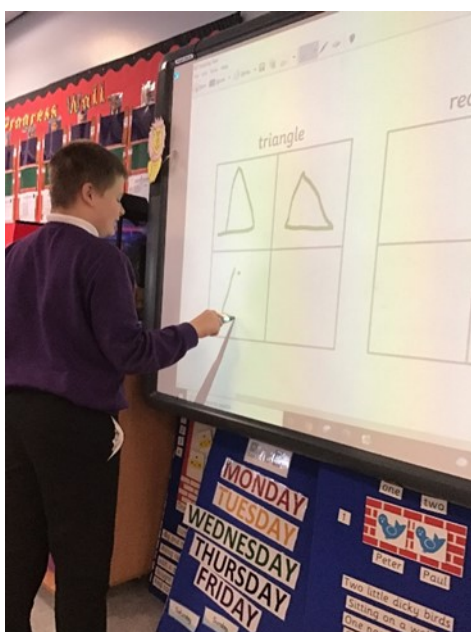


Excalibur Class

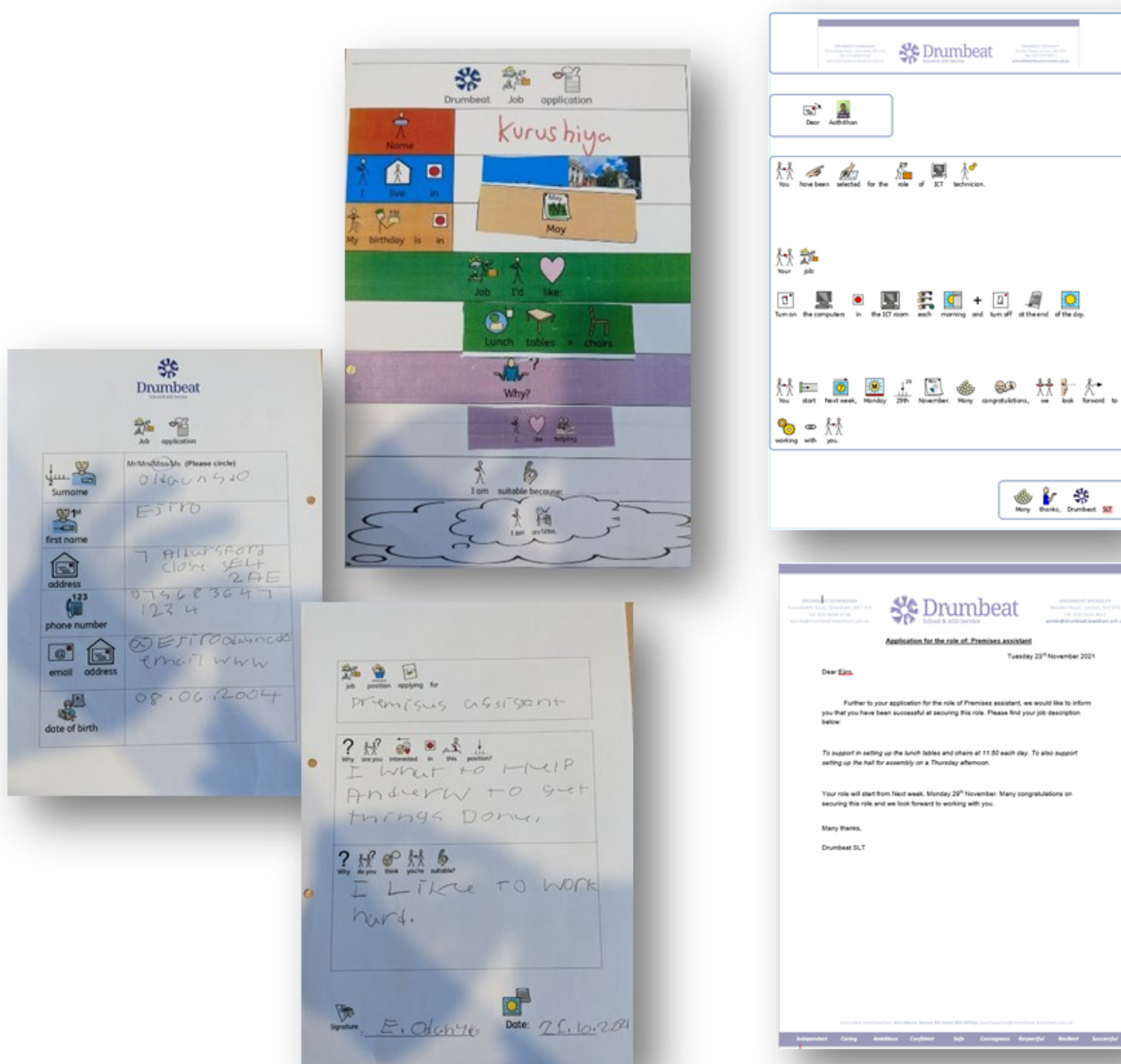
Southwark Independent Travel Training Bus

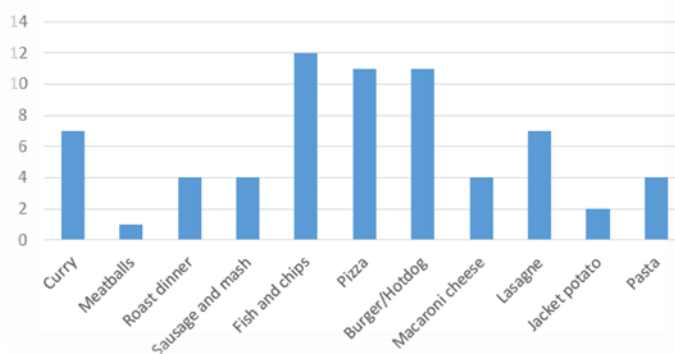


Brockley School Council

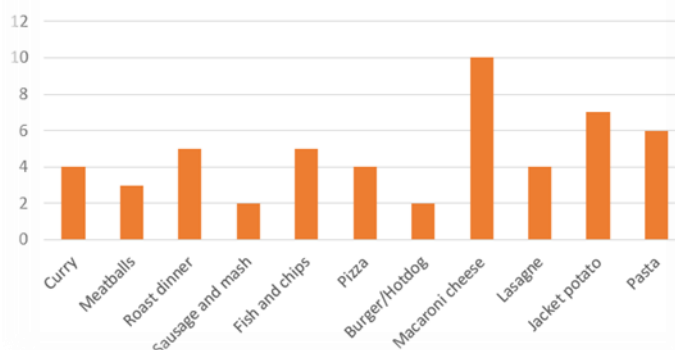



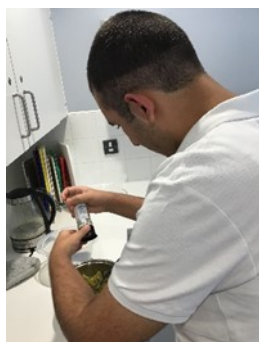


Olympic Class

Olympic Class have been gardening, planting strawberry plants and mowing the grass.

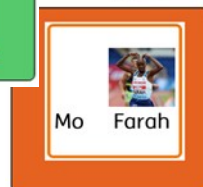

Olympic Class voted for Lewisham's Young Mayor on 20th October 2021.



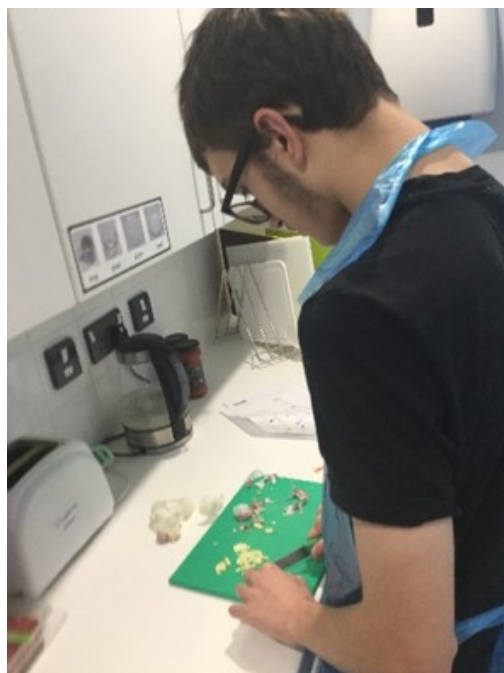
We made mince pies and have been learning to take selfies in ICT.

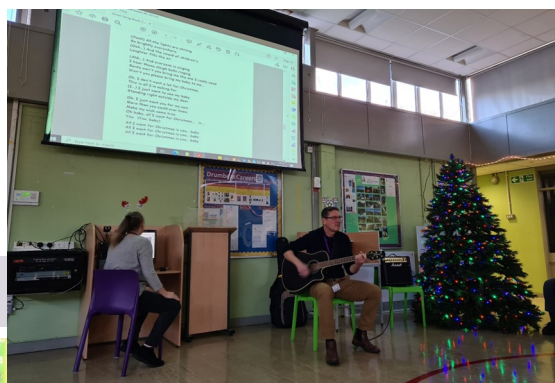
