Hello from Zebra Class

We have been so busy this Autumn Term and wanted to share some of our highlights with you. For this year's Black History Month, we explored and learnt about music, food and textiles from different countries in Africa and the Caribbean. We really enjoyed attending a drumming workshop and even got to participate in a storytelling session called 'A' is for Africa. Our Key Stage topic 'Travelling around London' enabled us to look at the popular landmarks, vehicles and monuments in London.

We have continued to work on improving our maths and English skills and worked on counting in 2, 5 and 10, matching quantity to number consistently and were introduced to addition and subtraction. We looked at the properties of 2D shapes, and sorted, matched and labelled a range of shapes within the environment. In English we engaged in Dough Disco sessions, Funky Fingers activities, communication sessions and phonics (RWI) lessons. We attended our very first swimming lessons and we all gained confidence in the water. We have also enjoyed participating in our weekly music, computing, PE, cooking, soft play, sensory room and art sessions.
