

## Gold Service £2,550 - per annum.

This entitles schools up to 6 days per year from April 2015 to March 2016.

Extra visits purchased at £425 per day.

## Silver Service £1,350 - per annum.

This entitles schools up to 3 days per year from April 2015 to March 2016.

Extra visits purchased at £450 per day.



## Service Level Agreement

The overall purpose of this service level agreement is to improve outcomes for pupils with ASD in mainstream schools by building school capacity through facilitating training and resource development.

Drumbeat provides guidance, training and work with children and young people and their teachers in mainstream schools.

The aims and objectives of the service are:

- To provide a responsive service which will enable mainstream schools to effectively include pupils with ASD
- To help schools to meet the needs of specific pupils
- To work in partnership with school staff, pupils, parents/carers and other outside agencies involved, ensuring a coordinated approach
- To support pupils in making progress and reaching their potential
- To develop staff skills and school resources through the exchange of knowledge and expertise
- Working in partnership with schools and early years settings, proving early intervention support so that children's needs are assessed and met in a timely way
- Providing targeted support to children with ASD in mainstream schools, including working with children and staff to disseminate good ASD
