
Children and Young People's Therapies training approach

Training is an important part of the Children and Young People's Therapies service, and our teams are committed to joint working practice, providing information and support for parents and our partners in schools and Early Years settings.

We are approved as a centre to deliver accredited courses and qualifications for several organisations including Open College Network London (OCN), MAKATON, Word Aware, Talking Mats and others.

We have designed our training offer to support universal, targeted and specialist intervention approaches.

The training packages have been colour coded to reflect which level is supported: **Universal**, **Targeted** or **Specialist**. You will see the pyramid tag at the top of each page indicating this 



Stage	Target population	Training
Universal "All"	Every child	Central and setting-based training for all staff/ professionals (INSET) and parents
Targeted "Some"	Children with specific needs	Therapist-led to establish and support targeted interventions for delivery by others in the setting
Specialist "Few"	Children identified as having specialist needs	Therapist-led to establish and support specialist interventions for delivery with / by others in the setting

For targeted and specialist training we may use a "Train, Model and Do" approach that involves school staff attending our training sessions followed by a therapist visiting you in school to model the implementation in the classroom or setting.

Our team

All our course trainers are members of the Lewisham and Greenwich Children and Young People's Speech and Language Therapy, Occupational Therapy and Physiotherapy Teams.

We are a team of therapists and assistants who work in a range of early years settings, clinic, mainstream, resource base and special school settings, and have experience and expertise working with babies, children, and young adults aged 0 to 25. We also work closely with families, school staff and other professionals to support the children and young people that we work with each day.

We have drawn upon these opportunities to create and deliver a wide range of training to help others develop their knowledge and skills to further support the children and young people they work with.



Remote training guidelines

Most of our training for the 2023-2024 academic year will be delivered remotely with some courses offering a face-to-face option at Kaleidoscope. Please check the course details carefully when booking.

Change in delivery method may occur depending on circumstances beyond our control.

- Please check your email ahead of the training. As information or course material may be sent out by course tutors in the days leading up to your training.
- You will receive a training invitation via email for a Zoom or Microsoft Teams meeting at least 1 day before your training – this will include information on how to accept/join.
 - Please provide an email address for the person completing the training at the time of booking
 - Check your junk/trash folder if it is not in your inbox
 - If you do not receive this link, please contact the CYP Therapy Training admin team: **LG.CYPTherapiesTraining@nhs.net** or the lead trainer for your course, no later than the day before your training is due to take place.
- On the day, we suggest you give yourself at least 15-30 minutes to join the session to ensure your video and audio settings are working.
- Please sign in no later than 10 minutes before the listed start time of the training so that the course can start and finish on time.
 - A contact number will be included in your training information if you need support to sign in on the day.
- Please sign in for the training using the name that you registered with – this allows us to make sure we have everyone we should and helps us know who is in the group. If using someone else's account, please change the screen name to your own.
- We recommend you access the training in a quiet place where you can remain focused and engaged without distractions from colleagues, students, or family members if you are at home.
- **Our online training is a professional forum, and like in our face-to-face training, we expect participants to be respectful of each other, actively participate and follow the training guidelines above and on the next page.**

Technical guidelines

To get the most out of your online training, we recommend the following:

- Use a laptop, tablet or PC with a webcam rather than a mobile phone. Some courses, eg. Makaton, require you to be hands free, and to see and be seen clearly to help facilitate your learning.
 - You will be unable to access any of our training without a webcam/built in camera.
- Check that your device is up to date and has a good internet connection – try having a video chat with a friend or colleague ahead of time.
- Check that you can hear and be heard by others – some people find that using headphones works better than the inbuilt speakers. Try this out by making a short video call to a friend or colleague.
- **Please keep your camera on.** We know this is a different way of training, but just like when we are in the same room at school or Kaleidoscope, we want to be able to see your face during the session (technical difficulties aside).
 - You may want to blur your background or be against a plain wall, as others will be able to see into your home or place of work.
- Check your lighting. It is recommended that you face the light or a window, rather than have the light behind you.
- **Please keep your microphone on mute when you are not talking** – this helps improve the sound quality for everyone by minimising feedback.
 - If you are struggling to find a way into the conversation, use the chat function or raise your hand button.

Privacy and GDPR

- Your name and email address may be visible to everyone else in the training session.
 - If you have concerns about this, we suggest you set up a new email account for the purpose of accessing training – this could simply be your name @gmail/hotmail...
- If Lewisham and Greenwich CYP Therapy course tutors wish to video or take screen shots of training for future training or promotional purposes, your consent will be gained ahead of time.
- **Participants should not record any training that they participate in, as this will be considered a breach of privacy.**
- Participants may take screenshots of training material relevant to their training and for their own use **if they seek permission from training facilitators. Content should not be shared via social media.**
- **Pictures of other participants should not be taken nor shared via social media nor email.**



Let's get sensory!

Understanding sensory regulation for learning and wellbeing in school



About this course

This course is designed for staff working with children in school who:

- Experience sensory sensitivities that impact on their learning and participation
- Have difficulties attending in class for prolonged periods of time
- Have poor sensory-motor skills, impacting on coordination and independence skills
- Find school challenging and experience anxiety in lessons or in the playground.

This course aims to empower staff to use strategies to:

- Enable a child to get ready to learn
- Promote use of movement breaks and sensory circuits
- Enable correct selection of sensory strategies, to enhance a child's regulation and wellbeing
- Improve a child's confidence and participation in learning, with use of a Sensory-motor Friendly Classroom
- Understand the difference between behaviour and sensory difficulties in the school environment
- Identify sensory overload or dysregulation and offer strategies to support helping the child to feel 'just right'
- Support activity grading and goal setting for tasks within school
- Understand when to refer to Occupational Therapy.

Designed for school staff, including teachers and learning support assistants, to improve the experience of the child with sensory motor and regulation difficulties in the school environment.

Speech, language and communication INSET and Twilight training

Early years and school-based training



About this course

This training is designed to be a foundation training upon which subsequent training can be built. It supports services at the universal level, facilitating a whole setting approach to speech, language and communication (SLC) development.

An INSET can be delivered across a full day, a half day or split into two twilight sessions depending on your needs.


Participants will have the opportunity to:

- Develop their knowledge of SLC and how this links to learning
- Consider and discuss the potential impact of SLC needs in the classroom
- Explore a whole setting approach to supporting communication and learning: 'Communication Supporting Classrooms'
- Take part in a workshop session to plan next steps and put learning into practice
- Develop their strategies and interaction styles to maximise opportunities for developing every child's skills in communication and language.

Who is this course suitable for?

INSET trainings are designed to be suitable for all staff. The content can be tailored to suit the needs and experience of your team and could include areas such as vocabulary, EAL or running language and communication groups.

About this training


Parent information sessions are designed to:

- Support the generalisation of SLC skills both at home and in school
- Provide parents/carers with an opportunity to share their experiences and solutions for supporting their child with SLC needs.



These workshops are based on the previous Beginners' and Foundation Workshops and are a combination of the best parts of both. The Level 1 and Level 2 Workshops combined provide the same level of knowledge and vocabulary that a complete Beginners' or Foundation Workshop provides.

This flexible and blended approach provides an interactive and hands-on workshop. By combining the two pathways, we have made Makaton training more streamlined, which provides a more accessible and inclusive learning environment.

The workshops are now aimed at both professionals and parents/carers, which means that all Makaton users can share a wide range of personal experiences, from using Makaton within the family to school, work and everyday life.
