Session Information

The multisport or dance activities will take place between 3-4pm, with half an hour either side for families to arrive/leave, play on the playground and socialise with each other. Use of a safe and accessible outdoor play area, plus organised multi-sport and dance activities on alternate weeks. Siblings and parents welcome to join.

WHAT ARE RELAXED SCREENINGS?

MERLIN ENTERTAINMENT RIDE ACCESS PASS.

Merlin entertainment ride access pass. This is a brilliant pass which allows families with disabled children to visit without the stress of queues. You can apply for the pass which allows you to go straight onto a ride without the queuing (you do then have a hold on the next use for the amount of time the queue was for). Also, carers go free with a disabled guest. There was a huge update, and you must book your ride access use for the day of your Merlin attraction visit. Once accepted this pass is for use at LEGOLAND Windsor Resort, Thorpe Park Resort, Chessington World of Adventures Resort and Alton Towers Resort for 2 years (Merlin entertainment).
