Bubbly Nursery is now offering After School Club for children aged between 4-9 years old from 22nd April 2025.



It is my great pleasure to congratulate you, Drumbeat School & ASD Service, on your brilliant performance of Ronaldo and Joshua as part of Shakespeare Schools Festival this spring. It was a joy to watch you shine on your performance night, and I'd like to spend some time now highlighting all the aspects of your production that I loved the most.

Your reimagining of this classic story, with an entirely new script and the clever renaming of key characters, was nothing short of brilliant. I loved how you brought the narrative into the world of two rival football teams, exploring the complications and tensions that arise from such rivalries. The opening fight, sparked by both teams sharing the same pitch, was a perfect modern twist that felt so relevant to today's world, demonstrating how rivalry can manifest in any context.

The performances were really strong, with impressive use of facial expressions and physical storytelling from all of you. I was particularly struck by the clarity of your reactions during the opening fight (or penalty shootout). Your emotions, whether annoyance, frustration, or joy when the other team lost, were communicated so clearly to the audience. I also admired the control in your movements during the slow-motion fight scene in the middle of the show.

There were two moments that I found especially poignant and impactful. The first, when Ronaldo is exiled and must leave, with the ensemble helping him pack his bag, was simple yet deeply moving. The second, the final scene with Joshua left alone after Ronaldo's departure, was equally powerful. The slow, deliberate movements of the ensemble, paired with the white handkerchiefs, created a haunting and emotional moment.

What I loved most about your production was how it showcased the talents and skills of your company. The rapping and singing were such exciting additions at various points in the show. The modern songs not only anchored the story in the 21st century but also served as a celebration of your incredibly talented company.

This was a fresh and dynamic adaptation of Romeo and Juliet from a dedicated and energetic cast.

We are in awe of all your passion, hard work and creativity! What you have accomplished is something truly special, and we are already looking forward to reimagining Shakespeare with Drumbeat school again next year.

We've had lots of fun learning about Chinese New Year, different careers and even making some yummy pancakes.





In maths, we focused on understanding the placement of objects (prepositions) and had fun responding to movement instructions after rolling a dice. We've made great progress in our mental arithmetic, solving a range of calculations and problems, and we are now starting to apply this knowledge in other subjects, such as counting scores in PE and sorting colours.

We have continued to work hard in our RWI program, with both groups completing set 2 and set 3 sounds. We're excited to move on to the next stage in the Summer Term. All pupils have improved their writing skills, including letter formation and sentence structure, and are communicating more fluently.

In PE, we've been learning to pass in pairs, play small-sided games, and participate in collaborative activities like giant Hungry Hippos, relay races, and target games. During Careers Week, we enjoyed a visit to our very own Beauty Salon, which offered foot spas, foot and hand massages, manicures, and hairdressing. We also tried our hands at being builders, creating walls using miniature bricks and mixing cement.




