

#### **School Lunch**

We are delighted to inform you that the Mayor of London is ensuring all primary school children who attend state schools in London will receive free school meals for the full academic year, starting this September. This means that your child and all children in Primary will be entitled to free nutritious school meals next year.



We know families are struggling with the cost-off-living crisis right now and this has not been an easy decision, but due to increased food costs and the cost of providing lunch which has increased substantially over the past 18 months, we have had to increase the price of a school meal. The new price for a daily meal will be £2.80 from 5th September for all year 7 and above.

#### **Dear Parents & Carers**

We are thrilled to share some incredible news with you before the summer holidays begin. We are delighted to inform you that the Mayor of London is ensuring all primary school children who attend state schools in London will receive free school meals for the full academic year, starting this September. This means that your child and all children in our school will be entitled to free nutritious school meals next year.

The Mayor knows families are really struggling with the cost-of-living crisis right now and so has taken the decision to provide funding to expand on the Government's limited existing Free School Meals offer.

All pupils will be offered a nutritious and delicious meal during the school day, at no cost to you. Every child deserves the chance to be able to grow up healthy and thrive, regardless of their background or circumstances. We believe that this initiative will not only enhance our students' wellbeing but also foster a strong sense of inclusivity and community within our school.

All children in primary school can now access a meal either funded through this scheme or through Universal Infant Free School Meals or means tested Free School Meals. So that we can identify which fund will support your child's lunch you will need to register at <a href="https://forms.office.com/e/ArZuK5GdCX">https://forms.office.com/e/ArZuK5GdCX</a> or by picking up a registration form at reception. You must register by Monday 4 September 2023. Your information will keep strictly confidential will be used only to check your eligibility for free school meals against information held by the DWP. It's also really important to still apply for free school meals in case your child is eligible for extra funding for our school from the Government, worth £1,300 per year. In addition, if you are eligible for Free School Meals, you will receive vouchers for food during the school holidays. These are to be funded by the Household Support Fund until March 2024 and you will be offered vouchers to the value of £90 per child for the Summer, £15 per child for October & February half terms and £30 at Christmas. The registration process is straightforward and confidential. It's been a great year for sport at Drumbeat School and we are looking forward to more after the summer holidays.




Please be mindful when parking outside the school and ensure that local residents' drives are not blocked and bus entrances are kept clear.

# **Kangaroo Class**






In Maths, the children have been working on a variety of skills, different ways of counting, continuing their money knowledge, different forms of data and positional language.

I am so very proud of each of them.









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Galahad students have also really enjoyed our trips to Brockley to support the transition that eight of our students will be making in September! At Brockley, Students bought snacks and drinks from the famous Italian Café over there and enjoyed visiting the facilities and interacting with the older students.



We also had a fantastic time learning outside the classroom. They all loved taking parts in the different trips we scheduled: Greenwich Park and National Maritime Museum, Swanley Park, Beckenham Park and Grove Park Nature reserve. It was wonderful to see how students were able to apply the skills learnt in class and they counted, identified people who help us and practiced crossing the road with and without support. They also had great fun in the visits!





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Alongside all these fun events, we have also managed to continue our hard work across all areas of the curriculum. Our communication lessons were on the topic of greetings, praise and complimenting others as well as using correct sentence order. In English sessions, we have been reading and writing all about the frog cycle and 'Lost', where students have made good use of their phonics and made sure they used finger spaces, capital letters and full stops. Some of the students were using adjectives and conjunctions in their writing, they made inferences and even peer assessed their work.

In Maths, we have been busy learning patterns, 2D and 3D shape properties and using tally charts and bar graphs inside and outside the classroom. It has been fantastic to see how much progress Galahad students have made during the year and how much pride they take in their Maths work. All of the children should be very proud of themselves.

Finally, in our topic lessons we have been learning about different countries across the world. Students learnt key details about these countries as well as geography. They even learnt how to cook traditional dishes from Australia, Italy, Kenya, Japan and Mexico!



It really has been a fantastic year for us all in Galahad class. I would like to just finish by saying thank you to the wonderful Galahad team Marcia, Morrica and Victoria. Their help and support have been invaluable for the class and for the students' excellent progress. #### **Tower Class News**


#### Tower class learners become set designers.

This term the students in Tower class have been busy designing and creating a scene backdrop for the end of year production of Macbeth. Perspex screens were kindly donated to us from Blue Tit hair salon in Brockley for us to be able to create our scene backdrops. Firstly, they used masking tape to create shapes on Perspex screens, then mixed ready-made paint with PVA glue and applied it to six sections of the screens using a chosen colour. Each section had to be a different colour and two sections next to one another could not be the same colour. Therefore, the students had to give lots of thought and consideration to which sections should be painted in which colour. Once the masking tape was peeled off the finished designs were fantastic and looked very effective when they were used in the production. Following the production, the screens will be repurposed and used as divider screens in our school café.



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As an end of year trip, Tower class chose to spend the day at Margate beach. With thanks to Simon who drove us there and the kindness of the staff to stay beyond the school day we set off in the minibus to Margate. We had drinks in the sun, played in the sand, went in the sea and wrestled with seagulls over our packed lunches! A wonderful day was had by all, as you can see from the pictures below.





As part of our enrichment offer, a group of KS4 and 6<sup>th</sup> Form students took part in a Shakespeare project this term. This has entailed exploring the themes and characters of the play, and studying older forms of the English language.
