School Uniform

We are a team of highly qualified, experienced and neurodiverse specialist teachers and outreach advisers working with children and young people with autism and those with social communication differences in all age ranges and across all educational phases in Lewisham. We are not diagnostic dependent.



We hold tenaciously to the needs of children and young people and put them first every time. We aim to support successful and meaningful inclusion through promoting and celebrating the strengths and supporting needs of the children and young people we work with. We do this through working with parents and carers, teachers and support staff, partners in education, health and social care and most importantly through respectful engagement with young people themselves.

We offer a free service to nurseries and work under service level agreements with schools. We also have an extensive offer for parents and carers including courses, monthly workshops, (offered daytime and evening) eight different drop-in support groups that run twice termly and resources and information on social media including our informative podcast series. 

As always, please ensure you are checking your child's home contact book daily.


