#### Literacy

We have really enjoyed our topic book 'Dear Zoo' this half term and the children have produced some lovely art work based on the book. We have used the story to explore adjectives and have had lots of fun with our animal small world tray. Flamingo class have also been developing their fine-motor and mark-making skills during our daily writing sessions and are all working hard on their individual communication targets. Our topic book next half term is - 'The Gruffalo'

#### Food group

Flamingo class have been enjoying weekly food group and cooking sessions where they are exploring new foods using all of their senses. While many of our children find trying new foods difficult, everyone has been willing to touch and smell a variety of food items and many of us are now licking and even biting new, unfamiliar foods. This is fantastic progress which we will continue to build on next half term. Well done Flamingo class.

#### Maths

Our topic in Maths this half term has been 'big and small' and we have had great fun exploring this a variety of different ways. The children have enjoyed Attention Autism sessions, sorting big and small items into the correct tray and developing their gross motor skills by demonstrating a range of big and small actions.

We have also been practising our counting skills and number recognition and our favourite way to practice our numbers is through song.

## **Giraffe Class**

Welcome back! It has been a busy half term and both staff and children are exhausted! The children have settled really well into Year 1 and their new class. We have established routines and the children are becoming more independent in learning activities. Look at the fun we have been having!





Our topic is Celebrations and we have had two birthdays to celebrate already this term. We had a little party and blew the candles out on a cake. We will celebrate every child's birthday in this way. After half term we will be continuing to learn about celebrations and festivals, such as Christmas, Diwali and Bonfire Night.



## News from Pathway 3

Pathway 3 have had a busy but exciting start back to school after the summer. There has been some fantastic learning happening in school but we have also been able to get out of school to go on some trips to bring our learning to life!

Key Stage 2 have been learning about All Creatures Great and Small.

Each class has been using a focus text to support our learning. If you would like to read these at home, the books we have used so far have been:



Each primary class has already been out on a trip this half term. Lion Class went to Greenwich Peninsula Ecology Park and went on a mini beast hunt, tried bird watching using binoculars and caught a water scorpion when pond dipping!

Penguin and Seahorse Class visited High Elms Environmental Education Centre and explored the woodland there. They also learned a lot in the education centre looking at fossils and birds nests and investigated which creatures lived in the pond.





Lancelot Class' topic this term was 'My universe'. They have been learning about the solar system, naming and ordering planets as well as identifying their main features. The students produced some fantastic creative writing about the topic and some great art work.



In Excalibur class, they have been finding out what goes into the food that we eat and are now able to plan and cook simple meals. Recently, they made Chicken noodles stir-fry. It was yummy!



Galahad class have been learning about habitats and living things in our Planet Earth topic. They have been carrying out independent research through internet searches, watching videos and reading fact files.



Alongside all this amazing work, each class has also been working extremely hard on their English and maths targets.

Some classes have been learning to use money in a functional way through role play experiences. They are beginning to work out how much change they would get if we pay too much. Other classes have been focusing on number and place value.



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## **Galahad Class**

This term Galahad class have been learning about 'Our Planet.' The children have been exploring different habitats and animals through reading, writing and arts.







We have also been developing our social skills through Superflex. All the children have enjoyed learning about new unthinkable characters who make us behave in a socially unexpected way. Ask your children to tell you a little more about some of the characters.

We have also been working on our independence through cooking and self-help tasks. The children have been working in pairs to create a range of simple meals.



## **Lancelot Class**

Lancelot class students have been learning about prominent black people who made an impact in history. The students also enjoyed looking at some African artefacts, making African masks and tasting food from around the world.



## **Camelot Class**

To incorporate Harvest festival and Halloween into our curriculum, Camelot class were exploring the book "The enormous turnip" and roleplaying the characters and acting out the story with our rather large pumpkin grown by someone in our community on their allotment during lockdown.

We then carved the pumpkin for Halloween and did our foaming pumpkin experiment in science.









## Wimbledon Class

Wimbledon class have been doing lots of activities relating to Black History month. The students have researched activists, politicians and artists in Black culture. They have been cooking Caribbean food; we made salt fish fritters, fried plantain and Jamaican patties. The students have also been learning about geometric designs on Kente cloth. They wove repeating patterns using strips of card and then decorated their weaving with their own designs and patterns.
