If you do not have an email address or you are having issues accessing this, please call Karen at Downham 020 8698 9738.

Even if your child does not eat lunch at school, it is important that you apply. The school receives extra funding to help your child if they are entitled to free school meals, we can also apply for other funding depending on how many of our students receive Free School Meals. So you wouldn't just be helping your family, you would be helping all of the children who go to Drumbeat.

Please be mindful when parking outside the school and ensure that local residents' drives are not blocked and bus entrances are kept clear.

EYFS News

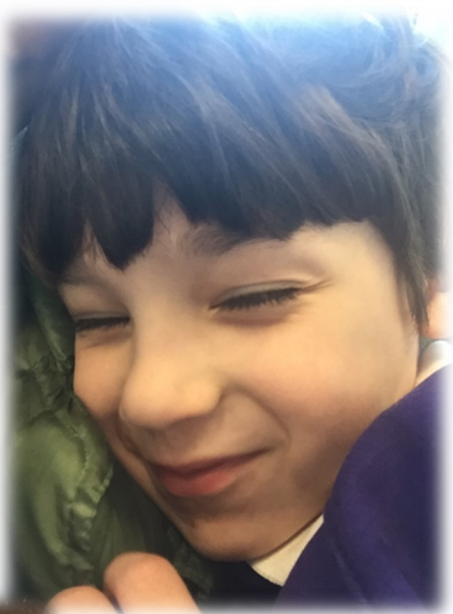


We have been working hard in EYFS and it has been so nice to see how the children have been progressing. We have been enjoying learning about the Weather and our RE topics Eid & Versak.

Big Welcome to Ahlam who has now joined us in Kanagroos.



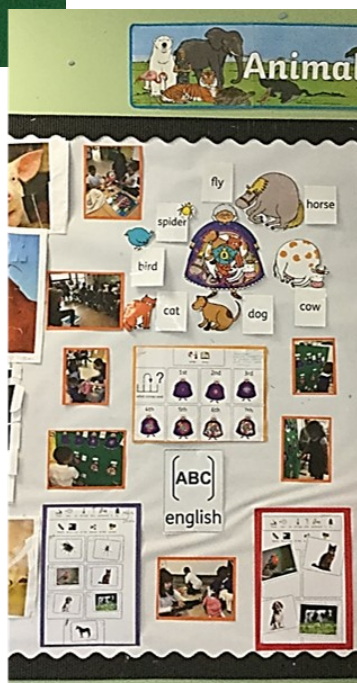
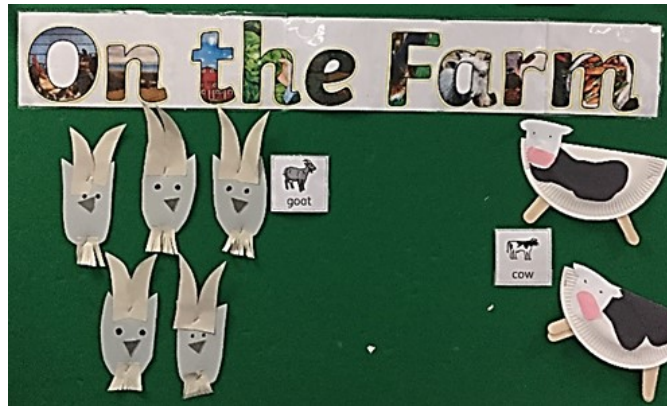

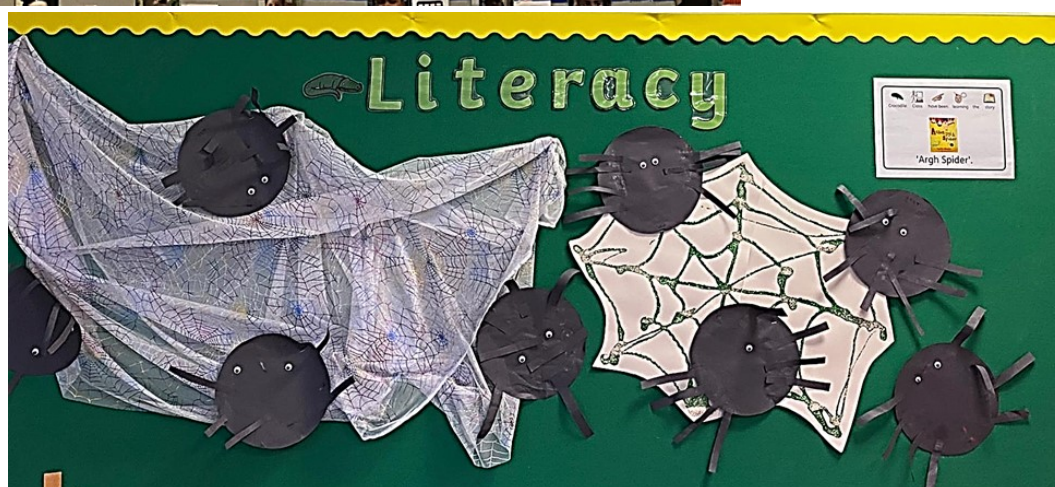
Key Stage 1 News

Zebras Newsletter

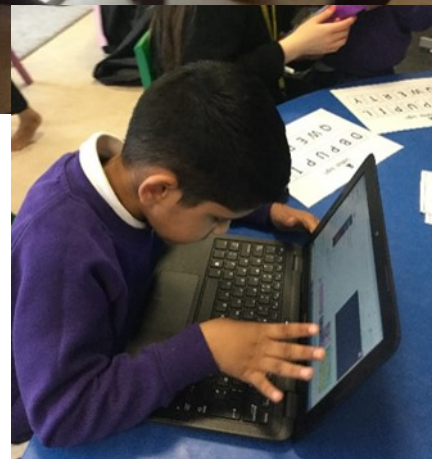

We have also enjoyed taking part in Roger's weekly art sessions and Angela's weekly cooking!

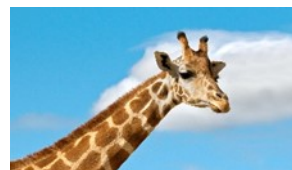


Panda Class

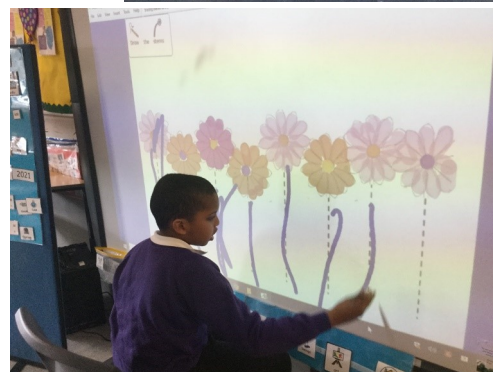
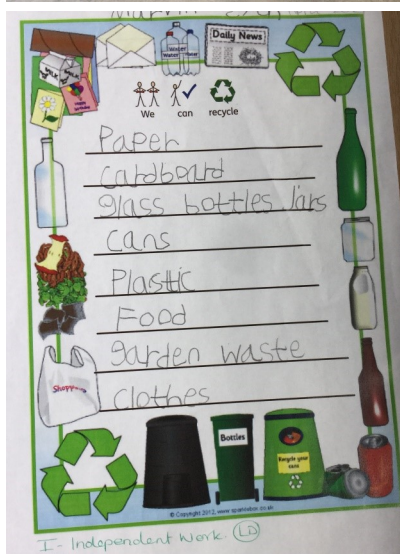
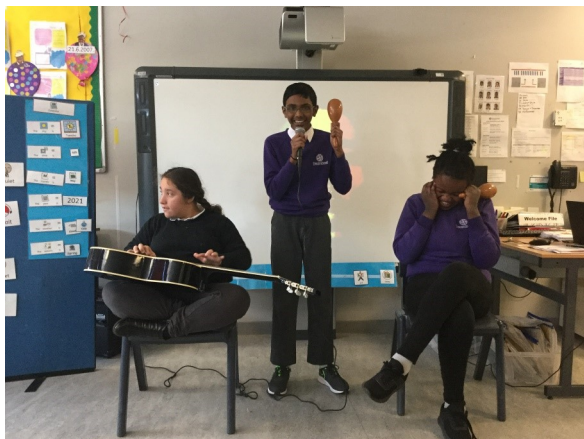


Lancelot Class

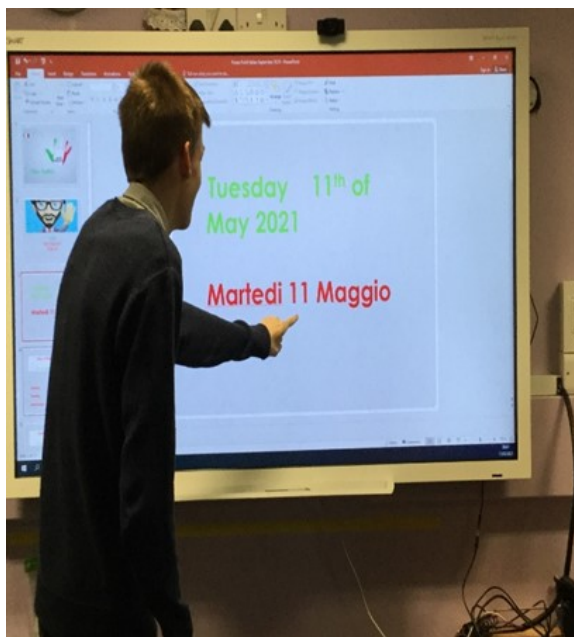
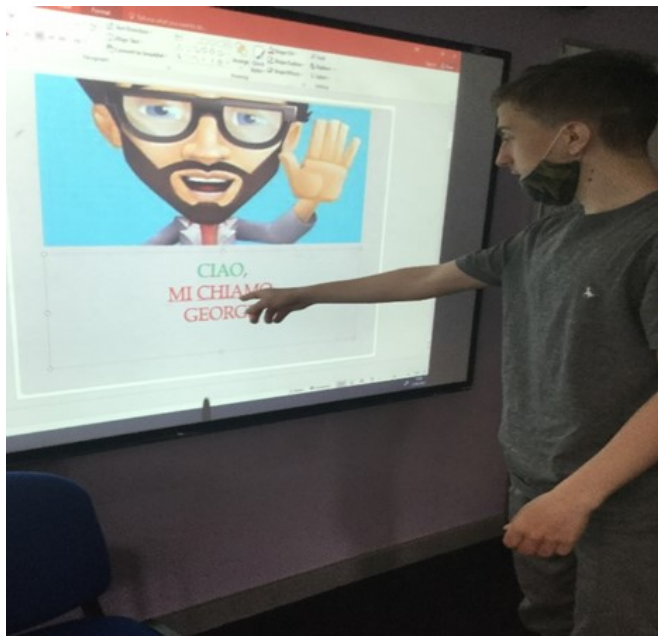
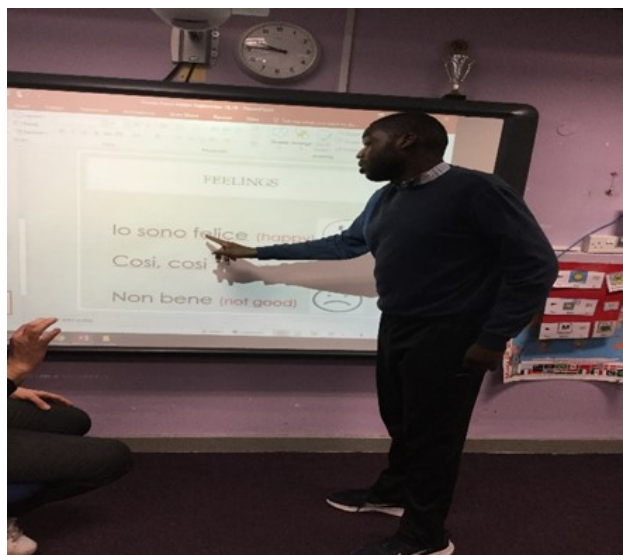

Fantastic artwork from all classes that used different styles and techniques but with the same aim to bring happiness with positive and colourful artwork.

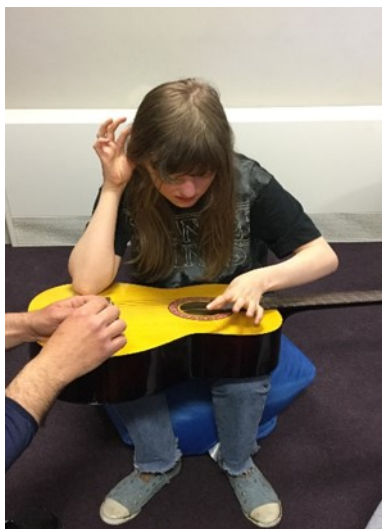
As part of the project, their artwork will be delivered to people who have been shielding at home, to the Lewisham hospital and other charities such as the Lewisham Food Bank that have worked non stop during this pandemic to help the most vulnerable.

Finally we'll have staff of different emergency forces that will visit the site to collect it and meet our artists.



Interventions Group Art & Music

Students from Shard, Battersea and Meridian class each week have been taking part at fun art and music sessions. Each session is supported by visuals and relaxing music that support their learning and creativity. In music they have been learning the difference between classical and rock music recognising different instrument and learning to play on the piano songs like 'we will rock you' and 'fur Eliza' by Beethoven.



In art it's all about our students being master of creation! Sessions are guided by visual but students are able to create freely using different combination of shapes and colours.



Weekly whole school PE sessions – COPY ME!

Every Friday Drumbeat students have benefitted from a weekly whole school PE session led by Adam. The sessions take place outside in social distanced bubble areas in the Brockley playground and classes from Downham have also joined via zoom. Each week Adam asks each class to share a warm up exercise or movement that the rest of the school copy for 30 seconds (HIIT). There has also been some free style dancing to the music too!

The sessions have been lots of fun and, while these sessions focus on the physical and mental wellbeing of our students it also enables classes to see each other again, interact, share ownership of the sessions and collaborate with other bubbles. We also have student sports coach Asad on his whistle to indicate the end of each 30 sec movement, thank you Asad!

A big thank you to Adam for setting up and leading on these very worthwhile sessions and we look forward to more fun sessions in the near future.





Olympic Class

All the students have been developing their knowledge of shapes in maths. Pathway three are creating a portfolio of work on Geometry and learning about clockwise and anti-clockwise turns.

They have also been shopping in the classroom as we can not currently visit the local shops. Pathway two found the prices from a price list and paid for their purchases with real coins.



Pathway one made shopping lists, and selected the correct items. This linked in with our cooking sessions that we do every week.

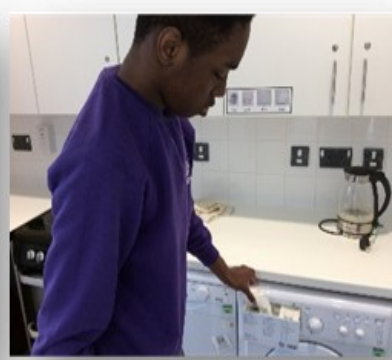
Wimbledon Class

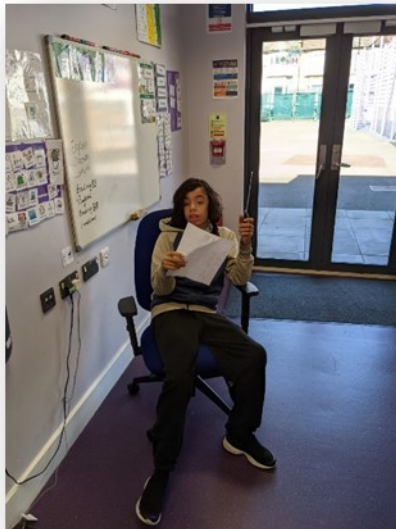
We have also spent some time practicing road safety and preparing to spend time in the community over the next half term. This has gone really well and we are looking forward to getting out and about as the weather improves.

Students have been learning how to use different tools by having fun, developing great team work and a result making a great difference in the school garden.

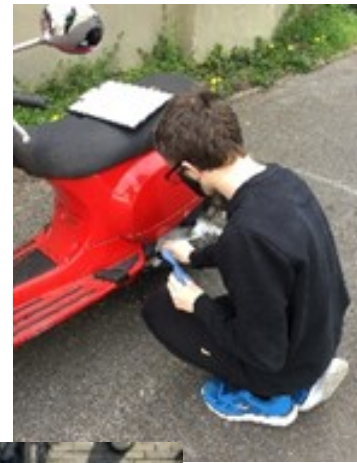
